## Welcome and Introductions

February Region 6 & DOT meeting updates: Hwy 63 will be moved to 3 lanes - Cities will need to pass resolutions - this will take a couple of months. Time Frame? Earliest to get bids would be summer of 2023 - early June be done by the time school started.

Grant through the DOT - Could fund lights - due mid August

The state is recommending a light to go back on 63 and 9th street as well as a light on 63 and 16th.

My Hometown Tama - focusing on improving downtown and increasing business.
