RESULTS FROM HS NEARPOSD LESSON May 2023

Description: STC HS students were assigned a Nearpod lesson about the soon to be installed RRFB. They completed it in PE class. Below are the results of the polls and quizzes students were asked to respond to. These are a snapshot only. Students completed the lesson on the last day of school after completing their final. Also, Neared capped the responses at 40 although more students were able to participate. We learned somethings if we choose to do this again in the fall.

Initial Poll Questions

<u>Students then watch a short video.</u> They were asked a few questions after the video to check for understanding. The questions were multiple choice or true/false.

1. What does RRFB stand for?

Correct Answer 68%

- 2. How is a RRFB helpful in creating a safer community? Correct Answer 88%
- 3. The RRFB will turn red to stop traffic so the pedestrian can cross the street. Correct Answer 25%
- 4. What is your responsibility as a driver when you see the RRFB flashing yellow?

Correct Answer 43% (Most common wrong answer was stop and wait until the light turns green.)

- 5. What is your responsibility as a pedestrian in using the RRFB? Correct Answer 83%
- 6. What other traffic elements and activities help drivers know how to respond to RRFB's?

Correct Answer 83%
